The Second Reading: I Corinthians I:I0-I8

Lector: A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

The Gospel: Matthew 4:12-23

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

People: *Glory to you, Lord, Christ.*

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

“Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali,
on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles—
the people who sat in darkness
have seen a great light,
and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death
light has dawned.”

From that time Jesus began to proclaim, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.”

As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And he said to them, “Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.” Immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him.

Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

Liturgy for Leave-taking

Deacon: In 2019, I was assigned by Bishop Gayle Harris to St. Peter's, Osterville MA. With God's help and to the best of my abilities, I have exercised with your trust my diaconal responsibilities and privileges. After much prayer and careful consideration and with the approval of Bishop Harris, it is time for me to leave St. Peter's. Therefore, I publicly state that my assignment by Bishop Harris as Deacon of this parish officially ends this day, January 22, 2023.

Presider: Do you the people of St. Peter's recognize and accept the conclusion of this ministry relationship?

People: We do.

(Deacon presents the wardens a letter of resignation, the Gospel book, and the keys to the parish)

Deacon: I present to you this letter of resignation signifying the end of this ministry relationship.

Wardens: We receive your letter.

Deacon: I present to you this Gospel book that represents one of my primary roles as the deacon - to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ and call the people forth to do his work.

Wardens: We receive this Gospel book.

Deacon: I present to you the keys of this parish that were given to me in trust that the doors would remain open to all people.

Wardens: We receive these keys.

Wardens present the Deacon with tokens of our appreciation.

The **departing deacon and the congregation** then say together the following prayers:

Lord, we have been bound together for a time as deacon and people to work for the advancement of your kingdom in this place: We give you humble and hearty thanks for the ministry which we have shared these years now past.

We thank you for your never-failing presence with us through these past years and for the deeper knowledge of you and of each other which we have attained.

We thank you for those who have been joined to Christ's family through baptism. We thank you for your opening our hearts and minds again and again to your Word and for feeding us abundantly with the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of your Son.

Now, we pray, be with those who leave and with those who stay; and grant that all, by drawing ever nearer to you, may always be close to each other in the communion of your saints. All this we ask for the sake of Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord. Amen.

It doesn’t cost you anything more and BIC offers cards from many local retailers or chain stores. 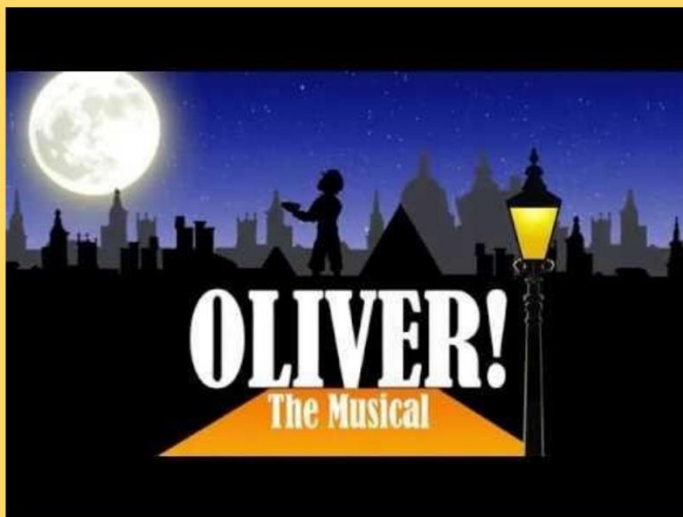
